SUBJECT: Fence at 700 Hillside

PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND

The owners at 700 Hillside replaced an existing fence with a new fence. The old fence had been installed on town property and the owners placed the new fence back on town property even though there was a survey pin located on the southwest corner of the property indicating that the fence was on town property. The owner indicated that they had the fence placed back in the original location against the back of the sidewalk to eliminate a 16" section of grass and dirt in front of the fence. Fences of less than seven feet do not require a permit, and only after a drive by inspection of the new fence having been installed, did the situation become apparent to town staff.

FISCAL IMPACT

The impact to the town is allowing a private citizen to enclose town property into a private yard. The issue is the setting of precedence for future projects and the question is does the town want to allow private citizens to encumber town property.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The owner of the property was informed that the fence was required to be relocated to the property line. The owner has requested a meeting with the town board to allow the fence to remain on town property


In the Town of Dolores there are other encroachments with private fences. The town's position in the past has been to not require relocation of these fences if there are no improvements or replacement of the fence.




Encroachments are only required to be relocated if one of the following occurs:

- 1. The existing fence that is encroaching on town property is replaced.
- 2. The existing fence that is encroaching on town property is repaired.
- 3. The existing fence that is encroaching on town property is extended.

It is the recommendation of town staff that the fence in question be required to be relocated to the property line, as this fence was replaced and falls under the requirements for relocation to the property line.

Town of Dolores Resolution No R496 Series 2022

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE JUNE 27, 2022 RESOLUTION CREATING A COMMITTEE TO STUDY AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE TOWN OF DOLORES TO BE KNOWN AS THE DOLORES ATTAINABLE WORKFORCE HOUSING TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, the Town of Dolores, Colorado is a statutory town incorporated under the laws of the state of Colorado; and,

WHEREAS, the Dolores Town Board identifies housing affordability as a priority community issue; and

WHEREAS, the Dolores Town Board believes that it is important that the people who serve our community including hourly employees, town staff and our teachers have the option to live in the community they serve; and,

WHEREAS, a diversity of housing options benefits community vitality and health and

WHEREAS, encouraging a diversity of housing options will increase the ability of individuals and families across a range of income levels to choose to live in the same community in which they work; and,

WHEREAS, housing affordability programs are extremely diverse including many options with minimal fiscal impact and many other communities in Colorado have implemented successful housing affordability programs; and,

WHEREAS, the Dolores Town Board is committed to evaluating the community's housing affordability needs evaluating potential programs to address these needs and implementing a program or, package of programs; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Dolores has applied for and received the Colorado Department of Local Affairs Innovative Housing Strategies Planning Grant Program.

WHEREAS, to this end, the Town of Dolores passed resolution number R490 Series 2022 creating the Dolores Attainable Workforce Housing Task Force and now wish to amend the provisions thereof pertaining to the residency requirements of the at large task force members.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF DOLORES COLORADO

Section 1. Task Force. There is hereby established by the Town Trustees the Dolores Attainable Workforce Housing Task Force.

Section 2 The purpose of this task force is to (a) with the Town Manager and any consultant employed to by the Town to implement and received the maximum benefit from the Housing Strategies Planning Grant; (b) assess the current and projected availability of and need for a diversity of housing options in Dolores; (c) identify any key information gaps and promptly work to fill those gaps; (d) develop an Attainable Workforce Housing Plan for the Town of Dolores; and, (e) make recommendations to the Board of Trustees and Planning Commission, which may include, but are not limited to: research and findings, a range of options to promote attainable housing; amendments to the current Land Use Code and Municipal Code that would promote affordable housing; grant and funding opportunities; identify vacant Town properties that may be suitable locations for affordable housing; and any other recommendations pertaining to the committee's purpose and goals.

Section 3. The Task Force may present one or more recommended programs or a range of alternative programs, which shall identify the fiscal impact of the proposals and identified community goals.

Section 4. The Task Force will hold all meetings in public with advance public notice and have an extensive public comment and participation component

Section 5. The Task Force shall consist of two Town Trustees selected by the Mayor, two members of the Planning Commission, selected by the Chairperson, and at least three members from the community at large, which may include (a) a presentative from the RE-4A staff or school board; (b) a developer, builder, or realtor; (c) a banker or someone in the mortgage financing industry; (d) or other interested community members demonstrating a knowledge and interest in the topic of housing options and affordability. The three or more members from the community at large shall be selected by the Trustees after advertising these positions for at least 10 days. The at large members need not be residents of the Town of Dolores.

Section 6. The Task Force's recommendations shall be advisory in nature and the committee shall not have the power to bind the Town to any course of action or appropriate funds.

Section 7. The Task Force shall adhere to all applicable open meeting laws of the State of Colorado and its meetings shall be conducted according to the same rules and protocols governing the Board of Trustees and Planning Commission.

Section 8. The Task Force shall present its findings and recommendation to the Board of Trustees and the Planning Commission not later than December 31, 2022 and unless extended by resolution, the Task Force shall thereafter dissolve.

Town of Dolores Resolution No R497 Series 2022

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE TERMS AND CONDITION OF THE AWARD OF AND AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FOR THE COLORADO DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE TOWN OF DOLORES EMERGENCY SIREN

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees previously determined that a working and effective disaster siren system is essential for the life, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town of Dolores in the event of flood, wildland fire or other disaster threatening the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Dolores applied for and has now been awarded a grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency's "COLORADO DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM" to fund a portion of the cost of replacement of the Town's emergency siren system; and,

WHEREAS, the Town previously agreed that if grant funding is awarded, the Town is required to complete the project by implementing grant funding supported by matching funds of a minimum amount determined by the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Town has been awarded a grant in the total amount of \$37,397.55 as described in the award letter and packet attached hereto as Exhibit A.

WHEREAS, matching funds for completion of the project is estimated to be \$29,640.45 for a total project cost of \$67,028. Matching funds may be shared with the Dolores Fire Protection District.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE TOWN OF DOLORES, COLORADO:

- Section 1. The Board of Trustees accepts the terms and conditions of the award of the COLORADO DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM as described in the Exhibit A, attached hereto and authorizes the Town Manager to execute the Letter of Acceptance on behalf of the Town.
- Section 2. The Board of Trustees agrees to procure the "Local Share" matching funds up to \$29,650.45 from its general fund, and because this grant awarded calls for reimbursement of costs incurred, to pay in advance for and seek reimbursement from grant funds pursuant to the terms and conditions of the award up to \$37,397.55.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Board of Trustees authorizes the Town Manger to takes such action as may be necessary to accept the grant and complete the project pursuant to the terms and conditions thereof.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Mayor, Town Manager, Town Clerk, and staff are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents and do all other things necessary on behalf of the Town to accept the implement the grant and complete the grant project.

<u>Section 5.</u> All action heretofore taken in furtherance of the purposes of the Grant and project are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 6</u>. The Town Manager shall have the authority to enter into negotiations with the Dolores Fire Protection District to cost share any cost of the warning siren system not funded by this or any other grant.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
