1. CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Reeves opened the meeting at 6:32 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. ROLL CALL: Board Members present: Mayor Leigh Reeves, Trustees Andy Lewis, Kalin Grigg, Sheila Wheeler, and Chris Holkestad. Trustees Mark Youngquist, and Duvall "Val" Truelsen were absent.

3.1 Staff Present: Manager Ken Charles, Clerk Tammy Neely, Treasurer Heather Robertson, Building Official David Doudy, Attorney Jon Kelly, and Sheriff Steve Nowlin. Public Works Director Randy McGuire was virtual.

9. STAFF REPORTS/PRESENTATIONS:

9.1 Chris Majors CPA reviewed the findings of the audit for the Town year 2022. No major issues were found. A loss of \$65,000.00 is showing, because of the purchase of the new Town Hall. A copy of the audit will be published, when approved.

9.2 Manager Ken Charles overviewed the items coming up in the agenda:

- Ordinance 565, Resolutions 533, 533, and 534.
- Managers search

Managers General Updates:

- American Ramp Company (ARC) held an open house for the public. It was well attended.
- Continued negotiations on the Sheriff's contract with Commissioner Candelaria, Sheriff Nowlin, and County Administrator Anderson.
- Community Center Board remains interested in the Town acquiring the community center and its operations. Staff are researching the costs.
- Manager position opening is available on the website.
- Website will be showing Departments, Building Official, Clerk, Treasurer, Manager, Municipal Judge, Law enforcement, and Public Works.
- The staff is working on a purchasing policy.

Manager Charles opened a discussion for onboarding the next Manager. There are 10 candidates. Each Board member will get to review the resumes and decide as to which candidate will be moving forward for final decision by a sub-committee consisting of the Mayor, a Trustee and Manager. The due date for resumes to be submitted is June 19th, 2023. Review of the finalists will begin after June 30th, 2023.

9.3 Sheriff Steve Nowlin gave the monthly calls for service for the month of May. He expressed ATV's will be cited for traveling in the Town. No Bear issues have been reported. Riverfest went well, no issues were reported. Two thousand people attended the event. There will be some cattle drives through town. Sheriff Nowlin commented on the discussion between the County and Town concerning law enforcement. He remarked that regardless of the outcome the Sheriff's office is obligated to protect the whole County of Montezuma. Manager Charles remarked that dogs are running at large, and he has been called for dogs

not being leashed on the river trail. Sheriff Nowlin will patrol the area more.

9.4 Attorney Jon Kelly reviewed some of the State tax laws concerning non-profit entity collecting municipal sales taxes.

9.5 Treasurer Heather Robertson reported on the month of May sales tax report, and a budget analysis for the month of May.

10. ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD BUSINESS:

10.1 Discussion/Action: The Board discussed the agreement between the Town and Martin Built Homes LLC. An agreement was submitted. Attorney Kelly explained the Developer is now ready to proceed. The agreement shows some corrections, or amendments on four buildings, containing eight units each. The Board agreed to move ahead.

10.2 Manager Charles reported to the Board that the funding for the generator has an estimated shortfall of \$16224.30, because of inflation. He requested that the Board approve moving \$16224.30 from the demolition fund to the general fund. *Mayor Reeves moved to approve moving \$16244.30 from the demolition fund to purchase the generator, seconded by Trustee Lewis. Motion passed unanimously.*

Motion passed unanimously.*

14.2 Resolution R532 Series 2023: Manager Charles introduced Resolution R532 Series 2023, approving the Flanders Park Master Plan. *Trustee Grigg moved to adopt Resolution R532 Series 2023 approving the Flanders Master Plan, seconded by Trustee Wheeler. Motion passed unanimously.*

14.3 Resolution R533 Series 2023: Approving a grant application for the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment targeted Brownsfields assessment program. *Mayor Reeves moved to approve the grant application TO CDPHE and targeted Brownsfields assessment program, seconded by*

Trustee Wheeler. The motion was approved unanimously.

14.4 Resolution R534 Series 2023: Approving a contract with Sage Messaging LLC. To provide contract planning services. The proposed authorized expenditure the Board authorizes will be up to \$3750.00 per year for the services of grant writer. *Mayor Reeves moved to approve a contract with Sage Messaging LLC, to approve contract planning services, seconded by Trustee Lewis. 1. CALL TO ORDER: Presiding for the meeting was Trustee Chris Holkestad

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. ROLL CALL: Trustees Mark Youngquist, Sheila Wheeler, Chris Holkestad, and appearing virtually was Trustee Andy Lewis, Duvall "Val" Truelsen, and Mayor Leigh Reeves. Trustee Kalin Grigg was absent.

4. ACTION/APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: *Trustee Wheeler moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Trustee Youngquist. The motion carried unanimously.*

5. IDENTIFICATION OF ACTUAL OR PERCEIVED CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. No conflicts were identified.

6. CITIZENS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD: This is an opportunity for Citizens to address the Board at this time or during a Public Hearing. Each Person will have 5 minutes. The Town Board encourages public comment by the following sources: Live at the Town Hall, virtually via ZOOM (see the Town Website for the link), or by submitting your comments, via email, to the Town Clerk at tammy@townofdolores.com any time before the dated Board meeting.

6.1 Michael Sawyer of 207 20th Street: addressed the Board concerning property owners in violation of weed control. He asked if the sandbags were going to be picked up. Manager Charles answered that they have been informing property owners to empty the sandbags in their yards or driveways. As far as weed control is concerned the property owners will be informed by a phone call or notice that will give the landowner ten days.

7. CONSENT AGENDA: No agenda at this time

8. STAFF REPORTS:

- Manager: Ken Charles: Informed the Board that the Southwest Citizens Alliance is filing an injunction for the Salter Y Forest project. The Town made objections to the Forest Service in previous years on several issues. The Forest Service did remedy the issues. The Town does not have any issues going forward with the project. City and Town Managers met to discuss the hospital. The Hospital has a new CEO and the group agreed to discuss some of the issues with the hospital. Trust Wheeler questioned an article she read about Governor Polis adding a growth cap statewide. Attorney Jon Kelly stated that the Town does not have a growth cap.
- Attorney Jon Kelly informed the Board that the liquor license section of the Dolores Municipal Code has not been updated since 1989. He will be working on this with Clerk Neely to bring it up to date.
- Treasurer Heather Robertson informed the Board that there was not anything to report except that she is working on the Budget.

9. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND ACTION: No Hearing at this time

10. ACTION/APPROVAL OF RESOLUTIONS:

10.1 Resolution R535 Series 2023: Awarding the contract for chip and seal to D&L Construction. Manager Charles introduced the resolutions. Staff called various companies to chip seal streets. It was decided to award the contract to D & L Construction. Public Works Director Randy McGuire explained the importance of chip seal streets. Staff are prioritizing the streets in need of repair. *Trustee Wheeler moved to approve Resolution R535 Series 2023, awarding the contract doe chip and seal to D & L Construction, seconded by Trustee Youngquist. The motion was approved unanimously.*

10.2 Resolution R536 Series 2023: Awarding the contract to install the Towns water plant generator. Manager Charles introduced the resolution to award the contract to Matthews Electric. *Trustee Youngquist moved to award the contract to Matthews Electric to install the water plant generator, seconded by Trustee Lewis. The motion passed unanimously.*

10.3 Resolution R537 Series 2023: Declaring the Local Flood Disaster Emergency has passed and terminating the emergency powers conferred by the April 10th, 2023, declaration. *Trustee Youngquist moved to approve Resolution R537 series 2023 to remove the declaration of emergency, seconded by Trustee Wheeler. Motion passed unanimously.*

10.4 Resolution R538 Series 2023 approving a contract Stephen P. DiNardo Consulting, DBA the DiNardo Management Group to provide contract services as an owner's representative for the demolition of the old town hall building in Flanders Park. Manager Charles introduced the resolution. Di Nardo Consulting will be drawing up a plan to safely demolish the old Town Hall, with minor impact on the community. *Trustee Holkestad moved to approve Resolution R538 Series 2023, seconded by Trustee Youngquist. Motion passed unanimously.*

10.5 Resolution R539 Series 2023 accepting the terms and conditions of the award of and authoring the expenditure of funds for the Colorado Outdoor Regional Partnerships Initiative. Manager Charles introduced this resolution for the Development of a coalition to protect wildlife and parks. *Trustee Youngquist moved to approve of developing a coalition for the management of wildlife and parks, seconded by Trustee Wheeler. The motion passed unanimously.*

10.6 Resolution R540 Series 2023: Adopting a Procurement Policy. Manager Charles introduced the resolution as the Town needed a purchasing policy. This will give fair and consistent procurement when needed. The policy does apply to the procurement of goods and services that are under a certain threshold amount. (Under \$5000.00). *Trustee Holkestad moved to approve Resolution R540 Series 2023, seconded by Trustee Youngquist. The motion passed unanimously.*

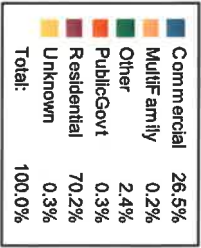

ORDINANCE NO. 565 SERIES 2023

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DOLORES LAND USE CODE TO PROMOTE
AFFORDABLE HOUSING**

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-23-301, the Town of Dolores (“Town”) possesses the authority to zone, rezone, change, supplement, and revise the zoning classifications or designation of property and to regulate land uses within the Town.

WHEREAS, the Town is authorized by C.R.S. § 31-23-301 to regulate zoning and land use within the Town’s boundaries, and the Town has in fact adopted a comprehensive zoning scheme.

WHEREAS, the Dolores Town Board identifies housing affordability as a priority community issue; and

WHEREAS, the Dolores Town Board believes that it is important that the people who serve our community including hourly employees, town staff and our teachers have the option to live in the community they serve; and,

WHEREAS, a diversity of housing options benefits community vitality and health; and,

WHEREAS, encouraging a diversity of housing options will increase the ability of individuals and families across a range of income levels to choose to live in the same community in which they work; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Dolores has created a task force to study the issue of housing affordability and make recommendations to the Board of Trustees; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has held numerous meetings to study the issue of housing affordability; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Local Affairs and the state of Colorado under the newly passed Proposition 123 provide funding opportunities to municipalities and developers for affordable housing projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Dolores Planning Commission and the Housing Task Force has recommended certain changes to the Town of Dolores Land Use Code to achieve the goal of promoting the development of affordable and workforce housing in the community as well to be better positioned to receive grants and other funding to support these goals; and,

WHEREAS, after public notice and final public hearing on June 6, 2023, as required by the Dolores Land Use Code and applicable law and regulations, the Town of Dolores Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended approval of proposed amendments set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

WHEREAS after public notice and public hearing, the Town of Dolores Board of Trustees finds that the proposed amendments to the remaining provisions of the Town of Dolores Land Use Code promote the health, safety and welfare and are in the best interests of the citizens of the Town of

Dolores, including the goal of promoting the Town's inventory of affordable and workforce housing, and should be adopted.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees wish to exercise its express statutory authority to amend the Town of Dolores Land Use Code as set forth herein in order to obtain sources of funding to promote affordable and workforce housing and to incentivize development in a manner to increase the Town's inventory of affordable and workforce housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF DOLORES:

SECTION 1. The Town of Dolores Land Use Code as adopted by Ordinance 556-2021 on December 13, 2021, and Ordinance 557-2022 on February 14, 2022, is hereby amended as provided on Exhibit A, attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. The Dolores Land Use Code shall otherwise remain in full force and effect except as expressly amended herein.

SECTION 3. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of any such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect _____ or thirty (30) days after final publication whichever is later.

PUBLIC HEARING. This ordinance shall be considered for second or final reading on the 10th day of July 2023, in the Town Board Chambers in Town Hall, Dolores, Colorado, at which time and place all persons may appear and be heard concerning the same.

EXHIBIT A

1. Section 2.6 of the Dolores Land Use Code is hereby amended to include the following Affordable Housing Definition:

Affordable housing, as further defined under Article 16, is either a rental unit(s) priced for households earning no more than 80% of the Area Median Income, or an ownership unit(s) priced for households earning no more than 120% of the Area Median Income. AMI information shall be determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and affordable rental information shall be as determined by the Colorado Housing Finance Authority (CHFA). The affordability measurements in this definition may be adjusted pursuant to the Town of Dolores Affordable Housing Policy.

2. There is hereby created a new Article 16 to the Dolores Land Use Code as follows:

Article 16 Affordable Housing

Statement of Policy

The Town of Dolores, Colorado, establishes the following affordable housing policies and definitions, adjustable as necessary to remain eligible for applicable sources of state and federal funding.

Dolores, Colorado, will aim to approve housing developments priced so that more rental households earning no more than 80% of the Area Median Income, and homeowners earning no more than 120% of the Area Median Income, can afford to live in the Town.

Where required by state or federal funding requirements, these standards shall be adjusted as follows:

Dolores, Colorado, will aim to approve, and as needed, annually increase the supply of new and existing housing so that more rental households earning no more than 60% of the Area Median Income, and existing homeowners earning no more than 100% of the Area Median Income, and first-time homeowners earning no more than 120% of the Area Median Income, can afford to live in the Town while paying no more than 30% of their gross monthly income for housing

Affordable units shall be deed-restricted for a minimum of 50 years, or a length as determined by the Dolores Board of Trustees.

Expedited Review

Applicability and Process Modifications

A site plan for a development project that includes at least 50 percent affordable housing shall be reviewed in accordance with the general approval procedures applicable to administrative review in Section 13.6, with the following modifications:

A community meeting shall be required for those projects that propose:

10 or more total dwelling units.

10,000 square feet or more of floor area; or

Development of 3 or more units on a lot adjacent to an existing single-family detached dwelling.

The community meeting shall be held no more than 60 days prior to submission of the project application. The Zoning Administrator shall be responsible for providing reasonable notice to the entire community of the meeting time and location along with an opportunity to submit comments for at least seven days following the meeting. The applicant shall be responsible for providing a project summary to the Town at least 15 days prior to the community meeting.

The total time between when the affordable housing site plan application is determined to be complete and a determination on the site plan shall not exceed 120 days. Applicants shall have 20 days to resubmit revised documents to address comments from the Town or the application shall be considered inactive and abandoned.

Applicable Standards and Adjustments

The project shall comply with all applicable LUC requirements with the following exceptions:

Vehicle parking shall be provided in accordance with Table 8.1 except that off-street parking for affordable housing units shall be provided at a minimum of 1 space per dwelling unit.

Bicycle parking: Long-term spaces shall be provided for single-family attached or multifamily developments as follows: 2 plus .05 per bedroom calculated across the entire development, including market-rate units. Long-term bicycle parking shall be covered, enclosed, and secured to the maximum extent practicable. Long-term bicycle parking may be located inside a building.

Section 13.5 Administrative Adjustments may be requested for any applicable standard except vehicle and bicycle parking.

Development Timing and Construction

The construction of affordable units in any development approved through this process shall be timed such that the units shall be constructed and pass final inspection concurrently or prior to the market-rate dwelling units in that development.

Submission Requirements

The following information shall be submitted either on the site plan or with an application for expedited review, as determined by the Zoning Administrator:

Name of proposed development.

Sworn proof of ownership and a notarized letter of authorization from the landowner permitting a representative to process the application.

The land area and legal description.

The proposed land use and the area of each use in square feet.

The existing zoning of the property.

The zoning and residential density of all adjacent properties.

Public and private utility service lines and/or main lines with appurtenances.

Title certificate or abstract of titles covering all lands to be conveyed to the Town.

Current tax information.

If the application involves public improvements:

Preliminary construction plans for the proposed public improvements including street plan and profile sheets, storm drainage improvements plans and other improvements.

A preliminary pavement design report.

A Traffic Study, if required elsewhere in the Code.

A draft Affordable Housing Agreement with the Town that documents how the applicant will meet the requirements of this section. The Affordable Housing Agreement shall be in a form approved by the Town Attorney.

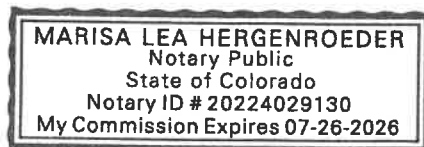

Section 3: The Board of Trustees authorizes the Town Manager to sign and submit the grant application; and, if the grant is awarded, the Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Town Manager to sign the grant agreement with Great Outdoors Colorado.

Section 4: If the grant is awarded, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Dolores authorizes the expenditure of funds necessary to meet the terms and obligations of the grant agreement.

Section 5: All action heretofore taken in furtherance of the purposes of the Grant Application are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 6: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
